# HRMI annual survey of experts

- February-March
- Secure + anonymous
- Respondents **must be invited** + actively be monitoring human rights in the country. They could be a:
  - Human rights defender, advocate, or other practitioner (eg, working at an NGO)
  - Human rights lawyer
  - Journalist covering human rights issues
  - Human rights researcher ONLY if they are working with primary sources
